

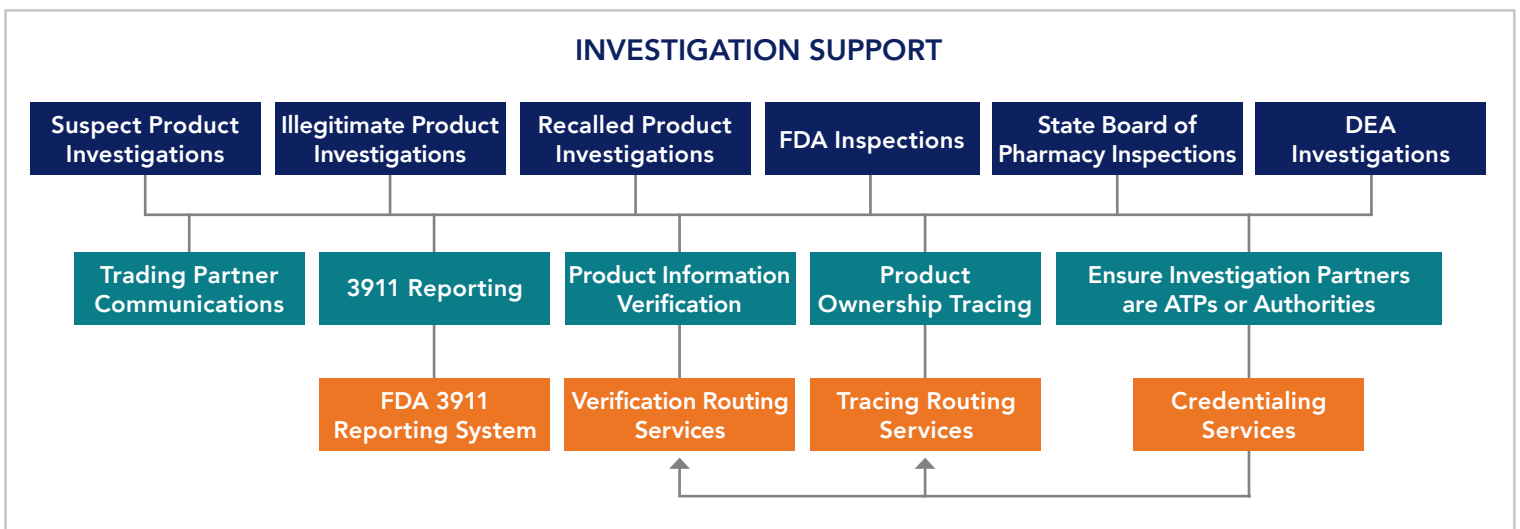
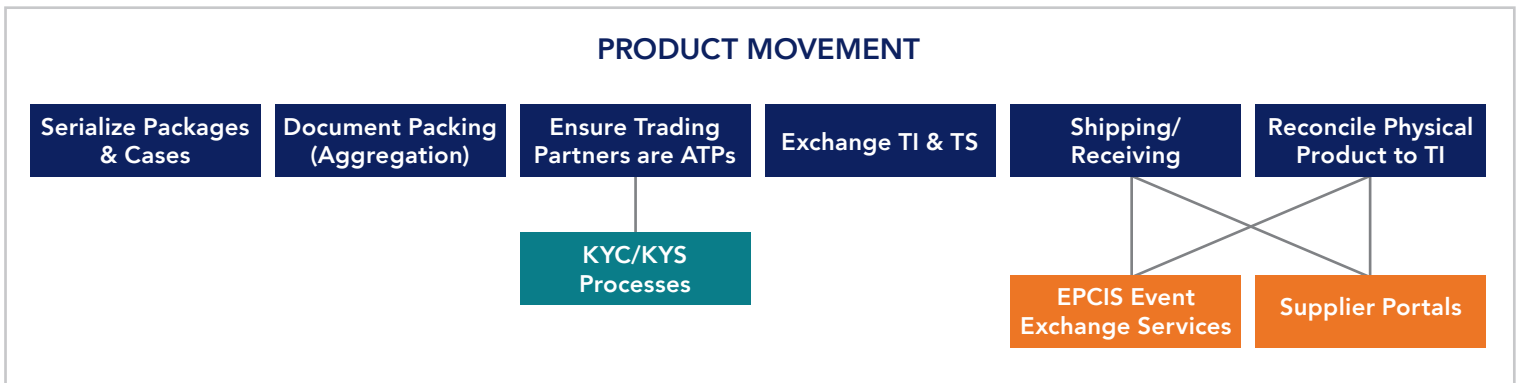

Facilitate Trading Partner Onboarding and Data Exchanges

Enabling setup and maintaining trading partner master data for Electronic Product Code Information Services (EPCIS)-serialized exchanges

Enabling setup and maintaining product master data for receiving shipments

Setting up and maintaining EPCIS serialized exchange connectivity with your trading partners

Empower to receive serialized products

Providing central repository to store TI and TS in an electronic database system that is operationally reliable and scalable

Systematically capturing GS1 product identifiers of received products

Providing the ability to reconcile physical products received with digital serialized twin data

Provide an integrated environment with a comprehensive view of electronic lot- and unit-level traceability data

Viewing and managing serialized inventory, shipment and receipt

Monitoring and managing the status of serialized exchanges, recall alerts and execution, verification and tracing activities

Providing access to historical TI, TH, TS (lot traceability data)

Providing training and operational support

Provide the tools to assist in verifying and tracing suspect/illegitimate product investigations

Implementing verification technical requirements as defined by GS1 standards

Establishing trust with indirect trading partners through ATP credential verification

Providing support for data access during an investigation

Obtaining and license your GS1 identifiers

Collecting identifiers (GLNs and GTINs) from trading partners

Taking legal responsibility of your compliance requirements

Conducting reconciliation of physical products received

Making legal decisions or provide legal advice

Creating or advising you on the drafting and execution of your own standard operating procedures

Being accountable for performing and responding to suspect/illegitimate product investigations

Acquiring your ATP credentials
